

Who we are

ALK-positive lung cancer is a rare form of non-small cell lung cancer caused by the abnormal rearrangement of the anaplastic lymphoma kinase gene. Diagnosis is not linked to genetics, age, gender, smoking status, or pre-existing health conditions. In fact, most patients have never smoked, and around half are under 50 when diagnosed, some even younger. Approximately 1,600 people are diagnosed with ALK-positive lung cancer in the UK every year, of which the majority are diagnosed at stage 4.

Patient & HCP Resources

Prior to 2018, no specific resources existed to provide information, support or advice for UK patients or HCPs regarding any part of the lung cancer journey. Abstracts & Conferences

Our independent research provides real-world evidence which we present at medical conferences globally. This research covers all aspects of symptoms and diagnosis, treatment and disease management, and patient life quality and outlook. To date, the vast majority of our abstracts have been accepted and presented at conferences such as Lung Cancer Nursing UK Conference, ESMO TAT Congress, BTOG Conference, World Lung Cancer

Conference, and more. This global visibility gives ALK-positive lung cancer the spotlight it deserves to drive real change for patient outcomes.


National Campaigns

In 2021, ALK Positive Lung Cancer (UK) co-created, with EGFR+ UK and the Ruth Strauss Foundation, the national See Through The Symptoms campaign which emphasised the importance of early diagnosis to HCP audiences. The campaign gained national press coverage and had an incredible impact online. This campaign was the first of many targeted projects in the pipeline for ALK Positive Lung Cancer (UK) as part of our mission to improve patient outcomes across the UK.

Patient Forums

Part of our patient-driven activity involves our twice-yearly patient forums. These events encourage patients from across the UK to meet, share experiences and learn from medical professionals and experts in the field. These fully funded forums are hugely popular amongst the ALK Positive Lung Cancer (UK) community and empower patients to have a voice about their journey.


Anyone with lungs can get ALK-positive lung cancer?

- + It has absolutely no correlation to smoking
- + It does not discriminate against gender, age or race
- + The only criteria is that you have a pair of lungs
- Symptoms may include a persistent cough, breathlessness, chest/back pain and problems swallowing

84% stage 4

4% of lung cancer patients are diagnosed with ALK Positive Lung Cancer. That's approximately 3,400 patients in the UK.

65% are female





There are approximately 85,000 living with lung cancer in the UK.
