What is ALK-positive lung cancer?

ALK-positive lung cancer is a rare, genetically distinct form of lung cancer. It is caused by a fault in the ALK gene rather than by external lifestyle factors.

Typical age at diagnosis — often striking people in the prime of life

Non-smokers

Most patients have no smoking history at all



A rare diagnosis, a misunderstood reality

Because so few patients fit the traditional lung cancer profile, diagnosis is too often delayed — making awareness among healthcare providers and the public essential.

Two very different journeys



Early-stage diagnosis

- Typically treated with surgery, followed by chemotherapy or an oral medication
- When caught early, there is hope that patients can be cured



Stage 4 diagnosis

80%

of patients are diagnosed at Stage 4

Currently incurable at this stage — but treatments are available that can prolong life, often for many years.

Easing the emotional and financial burden

Free life coaching

A dedicated, free life coaching service available to both patients and their families — helping people navigate the emotional weight of diagnosis and treatment.



Hardship grants

Financial grants for patients facing hardship as a direct result of their diagnosis, helping ease pressure at an already difficult time.

Our national weekend conference



Once a year, patients and families gather for a national weekend conference where they hear directly from — and question — leading ALK-positive experts.

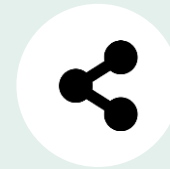
Knowledge that enables better conversations

Turning lived experience into evidence



We survey our members each year to gather real-world data on every aspect of diagnosis and treatment — from first symptoms to long-term care.

This evidence helps us pinpoint exactly where the gaps in best-practice delivery lie — turning patient experience into a tool for change.



On the ground with clinicians

We attend conferences and meetings of oncologists and lung cancer nurses across the UK and Ireland — advocating directly for best practice in every room we're in.

A trusted voice in the room

Our advocacy reaches beyond the clinic — into the organisations that shape treatment access and patient information.



Pharmaceutical companies

We advise pharmaceutical companies on the production of clear, accurate patient information materials.



NICE consultations

We are consulted by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) on new treatments for ALK-positive patients.

Anyone with lungs can get lung cancer

We campaign to raise awareness among primary healthcare providers about lung cancer in non-smokers — and use social media to reach the public directly.

- Educating GPs and primary care teams to consider lung cancer beyond the traditional smoking-history profile
- Extensive social media outreach urging the public to get symptoms checked — whatever their age or smoking status
- Earlier diagnosis means more patients reach treatable, potentially curable stages
