In 2023, the Patient Information Forum (PIF) awarded the charity Creator of Trusted Information status. The award is recognised by health information professionals. We had to show evidence that we have a rigorous procedure in place to ensure that all the health information we produce is accurate and easy to read. The procedure requies that each document is reviewed by patients, a carers and an expert. We can add a PIF Tick to documents that have been through this procedure

We're looking for volunteers, both patients and carers, to join a PIF TICK Review Panel. We don't envisage this being an onerous role as we would not anticipate that members will be asked to review more that one document a year.
